# Colonel William G. Brey Scholarship

#### **ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS:**

- Must be a child, ward or lineal descendant (including child or grandchild) of a living or deceased member of the Redwood Empire Chapter of MOAA. Living members must be a member in good standing for a minimum of one year and a participating member at the time the application is submitted. Deceased members in whose names as sponsors descendants submit applications must have been in good standing at time of death.
- 2. Must have graduated from high school or be scheduled to graduate at the end of the current semester. If homeschooled for all or part of the equivalent high school period, must be able to describe or demonstrate high school graduation equivalency per Star of California educational requirements.

- 4. Must be planning to attend an accredited 2-or 4- year college or university at undergraduate level or be planning to enroll in a professional certification program such as police or fire academy, paralegal, or paramedic training. The COL Brey Scholarship program is not intended to support graduate or post graduate studies.
- 5. Must enroll as a full-time student.
- 6. Must submit a complete application before March 15. The application and its instructions clearly state the documentation to be attached.

### **Instructions for Homeschooled Applicants:**

Homeschooled applicants are welcome to apply for the COL Brey Scholarship. We recognize that homeschooled students' educational paths can be similar or greatly different from traditional school, as can the reasons for learning in a homeschool environment. To evaluate a homeschooled applicant, our committee will need to fully understand the applicant's school, process, courses of study, and be able to evaluate any documentation from the applicant's achievements. This is particularly important for our evaluation of an applicant who has been <u>fully</u> homeschooled. Students who have been homeschooled during any part of their high school and have also attended traditional high schools must submit transcripts from those schools.

Students who have been homeschooled during any part of their high school years under a homeschool program, such as alternative school, organization or church must submit Private School Affidavit (PSA) filings for each year of home schooling attended per California Department of Education.

# Please submit the following information on your homeschooling on as many separate sheets of paper as needed:

- 1. A written description of your high school equivalent homeschooling detailing:
  - a. Why and where you were homeschooled.

    Provide the name(s) and address(es) of your homeschooling.
  - b. Describe what your homeschooling process involved.
     Were you fully homeschooled for high school years?
     If only partially home schooled, describe that portion of your education here, and then report traditional schooling in parts A, B or C as appropriate.
  - c. Provide a full description of your homeschooling course content, variety and challenges to learning.
  - d. If there are any transcripts or documentation recorded during your homeschooling, please provide that information. If possible, include any records of attendance and/or

hours of study performed.

- 2. An essay describing how your homeschooling experience provides for your success in college.
- 3. An essay of no more than one page stating your educational and career goals (required)
- 4. A list of school awards and honors, if any.
- 5. A list of school, academic, athletic or other extracurricular activities.
- 6. Outside organizations and community service activities in which you have been involved, and/or any demonstrations of leadership.
- 7. A summary of your work experience and other outside responsibilities in which you have been involved.
- 8. Please also include any special circumstances of which you believe our committee should be aware of.
- 9. A minimum of 2 and no more than 3 Letter of Recommendation from teachers, advisors, or employers you wish to be considered.
- 10. If you have been a member of the armed forces, please include a brief summary or your experience, including periods of service.
- 11. Provide all other information you wish to be considered as part of your application.
