PRESIDENT'S COMMENTS

My letter this month will be directed toward military retired benefits. California is the only state in the nation that does not provide a personal income tax exclusion to Uniformed Service retirees and survivors. California has the nation's third- largest Uniform Service retirees and survivors community with

approximately 165,000 members. Twenty-eight veteran organizations in California and the California state commanders veterans council publicly support AB 1623. Between 2013 and 2020 the nations population of the uninformed service retirees is increased by approximately 1.015%, while California had an annual decline of 2 to 3%. A significant cause for this migration from California is no exclusion for personal income tax.

The early part of this month I attended a two day zoom meeting for the CALMOAA annual meeting. During this meeting the most talked about subject was surviving spouses benefits. During this presentation it was made clear how many surviving spouses are not able to claim their full benefits. CALMOAA has asked Kathy Prout to develop a roster of surviving spouses in our chapter In order to give them the support they may need. Free Lifetime National Parks Passes Are Here for Veterans and Gold **Star Families**

All U.S. veterans and Gold Star family members will be able to get a free lifetime entrance pass for federal parks and recreation sites nationwide starting Nov. 11.



The pass, an expansion on the annual free pass for currently serving troops and their families, grants free access to about 2,000 parks and lands managed by the National Park Service; U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service; U.S. Forest Service; Bureau of Land Management; Bureau of Reclamation; and the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, according to an announcement on the park service website. It also gives discounted amenity fees in some locations.

While not every park or visitor area requires an entrance fee, many do. For example, Yosemite National Park in California charges a \$35 entrance fee per vehicle, while Craters of the Moon National Monument charges \$20. Other locations charge for entering museum or curation areas in the visitor center. For instance, the Begich, Boggs Visitor Center in the Chugach National Forest, Alaska, charges \$5 per adult to access a film and exhibits.

Those fees are waived for holders of the new lifetime pass. as well as those with the free active-duty America the Beautiful military pass or other passes sold or awarded by the agencies. The new pass covers the holder and any accompanying passengers in a private vehicle at sites that charge per car, or the pass owners and up to three adults age 16 and over at sites that charge per person.

The new lifetime pass program does not exclude veterans with so-called "bad paper" discharges. To get the pass, veterans must submit one of the following:

- Unexpired Department of Defense Identification Card (DD Form 2, DD Form 2765, or Next Generation USID replacement)
- Veteran Health Identification Card (VHIC)
- Veteran ID Card
- Veteran designation on a state-issued U.S. driver's license or identification card

To receive a pass visit a National Parks or parks and land agency store or staffed fee kiosk, or order via the U.S. Geological Survey store. Passes ordered online carry a \$10 processing and shipping fee. Passes received in-person are free.

Gold Star family members can receive the pass by presenting a self-verification form certifying they are the next of kin to a military member killed during service overseas. The form includes a signature block and confirmation that the user is an "eligible next of kin (NOK) of a member of the United States Armed Forces who lost his or her life in qualifying situation."

No other identification or proof is required for Gold Star family members who want to get a lifetime pass.

Understanding World War I

The guest speaker at the October Chapter lunch was Robert Kuchem, whose PowerPoint presentation "Understanding World War I" focused on clarifying the causes of World War I. The cause of the war is typically attributed to the assassination of Archduke Ferdinand of Austria and his wife Sofie; however, Mr. Kuchem's focus was that the assassinations were the spark, not the cause. He led us through the rise of Germany as a nation, through the war, to the armistice signed on November 11, 1918. A Q&A session followed his presentation.

DUES NOTICE

All regular members should have received your dues notice by the time you get this bulletin by mail. The notices were sent First Class mail, with an envelope that could be used to return your payment of dues.

From By-Laws: Article VII, Section B.

Annual dues shall become due and payable on the first day of January. Members who fail to renew their membership by that date shall be reminded of their overdue status and, if payment is not received by the first day of March, shall be dropped from the rolls. Membership may be reinstated upon payment of current dues.

Notices will be sent only to members who need to renew their dues for 2023. There are still a few members who have not renewed their dues for 2022 as of the publication of this bulletin.

<u>NOTE</u>: Members should not pay Wives Club dues unless their wife is a member of the Wives Club. Every year your Treasurer receives additional payment for wives and then passes on payment to Florence Wall for the payment of dues for about 5 or 6 women who are not Wives Club members. She then has to call and inform them, or send checks back to the member that has paid his wives dues in error.

Please note members dues are \$25.00 a year.

Wives dues are \$25.00, <u>ONLY</u> if they belong to the Wives Club

SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATIONS

The application period for COL William G. Brey Scholarships will open on January 1, 2023, and will close on March 15, 2023. Closing date is firm. Those eligible to apply for scholarship assistance are children, wards, and lineal descendants (including grandchildren, great-grandchildren, and great-grandchildren, natural or adopted of living or deceased members of the Chapter). Scholarship eligibility is limited to those pursuing undergraduate academic and professional certificate programs. Applications will not be accepted for support of graduate studies.

Our experience is that it can take some time for prospective applicants to gather all the required supporting documentation, then prepare and submit the completed application before the cutoff date. We therefore recommend that Chapter members advise eligible family members of scholarship availability and contact information early enough to give them sufficient reaction time.
