

Legislative Update July 2024

General Comments.

Federal:

NDAA 2025 is still in the numbers crunching state. Hopefully, we will see the final results by the Fourth of July. Therefore, the list of legislative priorities will continue as in the past few months with the only exception being that the Senate can include it as an NDAA amendment. (Please see the notes for the Richard Star Act below).

The Major Richard Star Act - Concurrent Receipt for Combat Injured Veterans: Two-thirds of Congress has supported this bill for the past two years. This legislation currently is in the hands of the Senate with a doable NDAA amendment. Passage as an amendment to the NDAA would more rapidly reverse the unjust offset requiring these combat -injured retirees to give up a dollar of DoD-earned retirement pay for every dollar of VA-provided disability benefits they receive.

Please request our Senators, who are already cosponsors to support a floor vote for the NDAA amendment.

State:

Although from all appearances, the State is broke, there still many subjects to be resolved before the budget is finalized

AB 46 Retired Pay Exemption. This bill is still alive, albeit on life support. Follows is an urgent request from the California Commanders Council to continue to breathe life in this bill.. Your support is urgently requested. Click on the link below

"Support AB 46" - Governor Campaign

Veterans: One of our priority bills, AB 46 (Ramos) is currently stuck in the Senate Appropriations committee, and we are launching a campaign targeted at the Governor's office to ask him to work with Asm. Ramos to move the bill out of the committee.

AB 46 aims to exclude retirement pay and annuity payments from income taxation for veterans and their spouses. AB 46 will help ensure that these individuals receive the financial support they deserve.

A JUNE 2024 UPDATE ON THE SOUTH CHINA SEA

The South China Sea area is increasingly important for the safety and welfare of Americans even though many Americans are not familiar with it. It is about 10 times larger than the Caribbean Sea, and there are 10 different nations on its border. Those 10 nations all claim the Exclusive Commercial Rights guaranteed by the United Nations Convention On The Law Of The Sea (UNCLOS). But one nation (China) is claiming total control. The South China Sea is well known for being an excellent fishery, and the bordering nations have long favored seafood for its dining tables. Less well known, but gaining in importance, are the petroleum resources that can be tapped in this sea. And increasingly visible are the extremely busy east-west shipping lanes from the Strait of Malacca on the Sea's western edge to the eastern edge near to China, Taiwan, and Japan. In about 20-25 minutes, the presentation can inform you about the importance of maintaining a free-access South China Sea. Violence by China has already begun as it challenges the rights of one border nation, The Philippines, to protect a tiny islet which it claims.
