Legislative Update April 2025

General Comments.

<u>Federal.</u> Many issues are still in limbo until the budget crisis gets worked out. However, there are some areas which we need to push on because they finally may get passed. A few of these follow:

- 1. Maj Richard Star Act introduced several times with strong support, but not enough to "pay the bill", is near being reintroduced once again. As previously discussed, this bill removes the unjust financial penalty paid by the disabled combat veteran who has his retirement reduced dollar for dollar from his VA disability.
- 2. BAH (Bsaic Allowance for Housing) Restoration. This bill restores to 100% BAH considering the substandard housing military families have been forced to use during the past several years. Ask your Congressman to support H.R. 1956
- **3. Military Spouse Hiring Act.** This measure gives incentives to employers by hiring military wives, currently at a 5% disadvantage compared to the national average and is tied to the Work Opportunity Tax Credit.
- 4. Veteran Caregivers. Reeducation, Reemployment, and Retirement Act. Serves to assist caregivers of combat wounded veterans.

COLA. Initial information shows that the COLA increase for 2025 will bw higher than last year's.

State.

General: On Wednesday, 12 March, we had a great day as all veteran bills passed in the first hearing of the year. The Senate Rev and Tax Committee passed SB 1 senate version of AB 53, SB 23, and SB 56 5-0 with no opposition. These bills are on their way to the Military and Veterans Affairs Committee for hearing on 17 March 2025 in the Assembly.

Details on these bills follow:

- SB 1 (senate version of AB) Excludes military retirement and surviving spouse benefits from state income tax.
- SB 23 Expands the property tax exemption for disabled veteran homeowners.
- **SB56** Property taxation: disabled veterans' exemption: household income.

Lew Wall was the guest speaker at the February luncheon. His topic was The Shenandoah Valley: A Good Place for Vacation. And indeed it is. It's a beautiful valley in Virginia, nestled between the Allegheny Mountains on the west and the Blue Ridge Mountains on the east. Using a PowerPoint presentation, Lew took us through some major spots along the valley, many having interesting histories dating to the Civil War. We moved from Winchester and its beautiful gardens to the Belle Grove Plantation to the Luray Caverns. Then on to New Market Battlefield, which claims the best Civil War Museum in the valley. Civil War reenactments can also be seen here. From there Lew took us to Stauton, which is Woodrow Wilson's birthplace where you can visit his birth house and library. We then moved on to Lexington, the location of Virginia Military Institution and Washington and Lee University. Robert E. Lee is buried in Lexington. After seeing pictures of Safari Park and the Natural Bridge, The Shenandoah National Park completed our tour. Lew's presentation certainly encourages one to plan a trip to the Shenandoah Valley!
